EOC Operations and Planning for All Hazards MGT346 - 24.00 Hours

Course Description: This course provides personnel who could be assigned to or work in an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) the skills necessary to effectively plan for and manage a large-scale incidents by applying and implementing an all-hazards, multi-disciplinary, management team approach. The course places specific emphasis on the planning, resource, and information management processes.

The course focuses on the key decision-making requirements within the Emergency Operations Center. The jurisdictional team will learn from the effects of incident decisions while working in an EOC using a simulated, notional jurisdiction as they respond to the final days exercise.

Prerequisites

There are no prerequisites for this course.

Recommended

Participants should have an intermediate level of understanding of the Incident Command System (ICS) and some experience in Incident Management. Completion of [IS-775, EOC Management and Operations Course](#) is also recommended.

Basic ICS information can be gained via completion of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) online courses [IS-100](#), [IS-200](#), [IS-700](#), and [IS-800](#).

Obtain a FEMA Student Identification Number

- **Federal Student Identification (SID) is required for each student.** DHS/FEMA has directed the implementation of the Federal SID for all HSNTF granted funded participants. If you have attended a federal training in the past 18-24 months you may already have SID #; if so select the option "Forgot Your FEMA SID?".
- **The procedure for obtaining a SID number:**
 1. To register, go to <https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid>
 2. Click on the "Register for a FEMA SID" button near the top the screen.
 3. Follow the instructions and provide the necessary information to create your account.
 4. You will receive an email with your SID number. You should save this number in a secure location.
