



PETS

- Your pets are much more likely to survive a disaster if you are properly prepared
- Make sure your pets are always wearing a collar with a phone number on it
- Ensure vaccinations are up-to-date



Make a Plan

- Have an evacuation plan for your pet
- Develop a buddy system with your neighbors or friends
- Have your pet microchipped
- Contact local animal shelters for advice and information

Build a Kit for Your Pet

- Food
- Water
- Medicine
- First aid kit
- Collar with ID and harness
- Travel bag or crate
- Grooming items
- Sanitation needs



Large Animals

- Ensure all animals have a form of identification
- Evacuate animals as early as possible
- Ensure your vehicle will transport larger animals
- If evacuation is not possible, decide whether to move them to a barn or turn them loose outside
